*Advent Candle Lighting

Reader: And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the LORD, and my soul rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely from now on all generations will call me blessed for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his Name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; He has filled the hungry with good things and sent the rich away empty. He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever."

Minister: We have lit three candles – for hope, for peace and for joy. Today, we light the fourth candle which is the Source of each of the others, and the very nature of God himself – the candle of love. There is no greater power than love. It is stronger than rulers and empires; stronger than grief or despair;

stronger even than death. See what love the Father has given us by becoming one with us and one for us that we might be called children of God.


